



Employment Opportunity Manager, Foundry Penticton

Overview

<u>Foundry BC</u> is a provincial initiative to expand access to mental healthcare, substance use services, primary care and social services for young people across BC through a branded network of "one-stop shop" centres. By bringing together a variety of health and social services under one roof and working in partnership with young people and families, *Foundry* will help young people get the help they need when they need it.

<u>OneSky Community Resources</u> is the lead agency that will work with almost 20 community partners to establish and operate *Foundry Penticton* on behalf of community. Reporting to *OneSky's* Executive Director and *Foundry Central Office*, this role will manage the daily operations of an integrated wellness centre for youth ages 12–24. The Manager will take a leadership role in the development and start-up of the youth wellness centre; the implementation of the integrated service model in close collaboration with identified partners; and supervise a small team of dedicated staff at the centre.

Compensation

This is a full-time, permanent position with a competitive salary and a generous benefit package, including a defined benefit pension plan.

Job Summary

The Manager will:

- Develop the *Foundry* model in conjunction with senior management, partners and *Foundry Central Office*, and ensure deliverables and key performance indicators are achieved.
- Play a leadership role in the development phase and start-up of the Centre, including working with all partners to ensure partner agencies needs are met for building renovations and integration of services.
- Lead the implementation of the integrated services philosophy. Oversee the day-to-day operations
 of Foundry Penticton and address concerns that arise in the process of co-location and service
 integration.
- Work with all involved agencies to fine-tune the service delivery model and identify potential challenges regarding integrated services. Take the lead in working with partners on solutions.
- Develop a Memorandum of Understanding with partner agencies.
- Nurture a team environment of continuous learning, effective communication and ensuring fulfillment of service standards in assigned inter-professional team(s).
- Facilitate best practices such as stepped model of care, inter-disciplinary primary care, and family smart, are at the core of practice at the youth wellness centre.

- Incorporate culturally safe practice throughout the centre.
- Liaise with Foundry Central staff to ensure two-way communications, knowledge exchange and collection of data and evaluation information.
- Represent Foundry Penticton in the community and deliver public presentations.
- Develop and distribute written reports and documents as needed.
- Ensure financial responsibility, risk management and accountability.
- Recognize and manage risk, and ensure that actions taken to prevent and minimize harm to clients of the programs and services, staff and volunteers.
- Respond to and/or provide support to staff during critical incidents and high risk situations.
- Maintain in-depth knowledge regarding resources and service providers in the community. Foster good relationships with these groups and establish positive working relationships.
- Perform other duties consistent with the position where required and/or requested at discretion of OneSky's Executive Director.

Qualifications and Experience

- Post-secondary degree in a relevant discipline.
- Minimum five years' experience related to areas of nursing, social work, community development, counselling, health and/or leadership.
- Direct program set-up and delivery experience in the community social services sector.
- Experience with youth services and integrated services.
- Clinical experience and knowledge of team-based care and/or stepped-care models.
- Proven ability to work effectively during crisis.
- Demonstrated capacity to effectively engage in leadership and management processes, including multidisciplinary and/or cross sector initiatives.
- Demonstrated working knowledge of government and community based programs and related provincial and community support systems.
- Exceptional interpersonal skills and a proven track record in of building and maintaining effective working relationships with a range of internal and external stakeholders.
- Excellent organization, time and general management skills.
- High proficiency in oral and written communication.
- Ability to prioritize and manage multiple priorities to deliver on agreed deadlines.
- Must be youth-friendly and have a broad understanding of their individual experiences, challenges in addition to an awareness of community factors that impact them.

An equivalent combination of qualifications and experience may be considered.
