# Partnership and Leadership Tables

## **PCRS Board of Directors**

• On **April 4**<sup>th</sup>, the PCRS Board of Directors held one of their meetings at the Foundry Surrey site, giving them an opportunity to tour the facilities and receive an update on the proposed designs.

Jennifer Lowrey, Manager of Foundry Surrey, also provided the board with updates on Foundry Surrey's development. Vivian Smith, President of Liberty Quest Enterprises Inc. and the contracted lead for Foundry Surrey's capital campaign, gave a short presentation on philanthropy and the capital campaign plan. The Board of Directors meeting had room for questions, great conversations, and members left with a tote bag of awesome Foundry Surrey swag. ### **Operations Working Group (OWG)**





The Operations Working Group (OWG) reconvened on **April 5**<sup>th</sup> with special guests Rick Dubras (Leader, Implementation and Integration) and Julia Gray (Research and Evaluation Associate) from Foundry Central Office to deliver presentations to the group. Julia introduced the **Foundry Toolbox system**, a client database system used by Foundry centres to track centre data including client information, needs, and type of service accessed. It was helpful for the partners to walk through a demonstration and develop an understanding of how the client service experience begins through an interaction with Toolbox where they tell their story once and can receive an assessment based on their needs at the moment. Rick gave an informative presentation on supporting a **collaborative substance use strategy implementation**, walking the partners through the continuum of services from health promotion to prevention and examples of different programs to fulfill the stepped care model. The meeting helped prepare the partners for the next

step of building the services, systems, and pathways that will compose Foundry Surrey's delivery model. The group will reconvene on July 5<sup>th</sup> to report on the progress of all the working groups, ensure the work is meeting the gaps identified, and maintain a unified vision for Foundry Surrey.



## **Working Groups**

- To start planning out Foundry Surrey's core services, the Operations Working Group broke off into four smaller working groups at the end of March 2023. The intention is to meet regularly on a bi-weekly or tri-weekly basis to complete a series of operations planning for each core service, including to: confirm partner membership, work together to build services that address the identified community gaps and meet needs every step of the way throughout Foundry's Integrated Stepped Care Model, develop communication systems, confirm site functionality needs, create referral pathways, build staffing and scheduling, and more.
  - Primary Care Working Group: first meeting on April 13th.
  - Mental Health and Substance Use Working Group: first meeting on May 31st.
  - Social Services Working Group: first meeting on May 31st.
  - Peer Support Working Group: starting up soon!

## Community Leadership Table (CLT)

 On March 15<sup>th</sup>, the Community Leadership Table (CLT) came together for their first quarterly meeting of 2023. This meeting was held at the Foundry Surrey site and members, who had not previously seen the space, were able to tour. As it had been a year since the CLT last met, they were updated on the development of Foundry




Surrey regarding the Operations Working Group and the site planning process. The table also had the opportunity to meet Vivian Smith, a Certified Fund Raising Executive who has been contracted to lead Foundry Surrey's capital campaign. Vivian informed the CLT that **Foundry Surrey's capital campaign of \$6 million dollars would be starting shortly** and encouraged members to reach out if they had **any ideas on how to support the campaign**. The Community Leadership Table will be meeting again in July – we can't wait to come

back together!

#### Hi all!



## E. Twelve more Foundry centres coming to support young people and their families in B.C.

 In April, the Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions announced that the government will fund
12 new Foundry centres across the province to provide young people, ages 12-24, and their families access to mental health services, peer supports, substance use services, physical and

sexual health care, social services, and other wellness resources. The funding budget provides more than **\$236 million over three years** for Foundry centres to provide needed services for their communities. These additional Foundry centres will join the 15 centres that are up and running as well as the 8 centres that are currently in development as an integral part of **A Pathway to Hope, B.C.'s roadmap for building a comprehensive system of mental-health**

## Peer & Community Engagement and Communications

As 2023 progresses, we are continuing to spread awareness of the upcoming Foundry Surrey centre and engage with community through hosting booths at events and presentations:

 On April 17<sup>th</sup>, we were Dragons for a day when we visited Fleetwood Park Secondary to present at their Grade 9 Health Conference. We were joined by two YELT members who supported us talking to grade





9s about what mental health is, how it can look different for everyone, and how Foundry Surrey can support youth when the centre opens. Thanks so much to the Fleetwood Park Secondary teachers for organizing this valuable conference and inviting us. Shoutout to Lily and Evy who rocked the presentations!

The Surrey School District held a Mental Wellness Day for elementary and secondary school students on April 28<sup>th</sup>. Foundry Surrey, as well as other community organizations, were invited to the Sullivan Heights Secondary School to host booths and speak to attendees about the services they can access when their mental health is low. We were also invited to speak on panels at the Bell Performing Arts Centre where we shared information about Foundry Surrey, the services that will be provided when doors open, and why youth should look after their mental wellbeing. On **May 5th**, Foundry Surrey hosted a booth, with the support of youth leader, Aryan, at the Cross-Cultural Mental Health: Research Practice Forum at the SFU Surrey Campus. At this event we connected with researchers, practitioners, students, and other community organizations to learn and share how we can adjust mental health practices to be culturally safe and relevant to different communities such as South Asians. We also had the amazing opportunity to meet Honourable Jennifer Whiteside, the Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, at the event. She

expressed her admiration for the commitment Foundry centres make to provide services that meet youth and families where they are at and shared her enthusiasm for Foundry to soon open in Surrey. Thank you to SFU Surrey, Moving Forward Family Services, and CAMH for organizing this important event! We can't wait to put what we learnt into practice when our doors open.

We also held a presentation at PCRS' very own Newton Youth Hub on **May 26**<sup>th</sup> where we connected with youth about what mental health is, how it can show up differently for everyone, and brainstormed ways to cope with low mental health. We shared what services Foundry Surrey will provide when our doors open next year and virtual services that youth can access in the meantime. As many of the





youth attending spoke various languages, PCRS staff were present to help translate as well as learn more about Foundry Surrey themselves! Thanks Newton Youth Hub for inviting us over – we had a blast interacting with youth and eating Timbits!


