This can be edited with Adobe editor. If the centres don't have access to Adobe, please forward the info to Stephanie and she can update the cards. Alternatively, centers can work directly with Foundry centre specific communications person to create centre specific materials. *Centre specific materials require review and approval by FCO communications team prior to sharing with external communities. FCO communications promise to keep a short turnaround time for approval of the materials. Feedbacks are always welcome→ this informs FCO the needs from the community and the gaps of the support provided. Inquiry regarding promotional materials geared towards communities at large or other programs, le. Family practices from FCO FW directly. IPS received referrals from Primary Care settings and would like to share materials regarding FW with them to create awareness of the program. Currently, FCO has been working with individuals centre to support their promotional needs. Each community needs are quite different. FCO is planning some provincial initiative as well, ie. Workshops for youth. Hope this will address the needs from youth in a global sense. Foundry central monthly updates→ Newsletters were sent to the centre. Newsletter included more detailed FW resources. Matt and Judy newly joined FW at FCO→ Matt: Manger, Services Integration and Implementation for FW.	Please provide feedback regarding the "FW Funding, Reporting and Budget Overview" document and reach out for assistance if required.
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- Workshop development- based on youth's needs	 FCO thanks everyone for working tirelessly to submit their financial reports within a tight turnaround. Matt reached out to various centres for further clarification. Matt is available by email to assist any inquiries regarding the budget outlined on the reporting guideline document sent last week. This document included Wage subsidy information. FW is supported via 3 funders: Service Canada Youth Employment and Skills Strategy (YESS), Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction (MSDPR) and Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH). Centre updates→ 11/13 centres have hired support workers. 54 youth enrolled in the program as of end of Sept and 15 have achieved outcome. Great work with the environmental scan identifying gaps where the young people require assistance and how FW can assist.

Wage subsidized quality employment opportunities- centre preparation and assistance required - Guideline - Template	 FCO is working on developing templates, such as contracts with the employer that provide the wages to the youth, to support cases where wage subsidize employment opportunities arise. FCO will share the documents as soon as they are finalized.

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Virtual referral process - Pathway in development	 Foundry virtual was created to support youth, that don't have access to a Foundry centre in their community, access to a virtual care team. The virtual care pathway is in development and will be shared with the centres soon to collect feedback asap. IPS staff indicated that they have been receiving referrals from 	FCO FW team to send out a Summary of IPS staff in each centre and contact info to facilitate connection between the centres.

Research and Evaluation FAQs - Research component - Toolbox	 FW is hoping to obtain long term support/ funding from SC. IPS is evidence based and supported by research, but this initiative is still new. The more information and outcome of success FW can collect, the stronger business case it will be to request for future funding to expand to other communities. Cassia, Anna-Joy and Amanda are the research team at FCO that will provide support to FW research needs. 	•
