Research update O Northern Voices Project Data Presentation	 UBC Capstone project: Implementation of Supported Employment in Northern BC Presenters: Ms. Jessica Su and Ms. Nicole Willow → graduate students for occupational therapy program. Study Objective: Understand the strengths and limitations of implementing supported employment for youth in a Northern BC context from the perspectives of employment counselors. Geographic area covered: Prince George, Terrace, Fort St. John, and Prince Rupert Results: Themes emerged from the qualitative data based on 9 participants. 3 global themes: Within employment counsellor's capabilities, Changes at the organizational level, Societal factors influencing employment. It often felt that the voice of the northern region is not heard and physical spacing is a barrier. It is important to build relationships with the youth as well as the employers. It is important to increase awareness and reduce stigma around at-risk youth or youth with mental health barriers. Allowing youth, the autonomy, meeting youth where they are at, leveraging family support. Staff felt that the presentation was a great summary of the barriers faced in the Northern region. A suggestion for Foundry to create an employer event to reach more employers at the same time. 	Looking for youth participants ages 16-24 in the northern region to participate in further research studies.
