If the answer is YES, then we can help!


# What is CARIBOU by CAMH?

- A **multidisciplinary care plan** that is **evidence-based** and was created for treating youth (13-18 yrs) with depression.
- It uses **measurement-based care** to provide youth with detailed feedback on their progress. This **allows youth to make important treatment decisions with their care providers**.
- A pilot study has shown that it is **user-friendly**, **feasible**, and associated with **improved outcomes**.

# What does CARIBOU by CAMH look like for youth?





### What are we asking?

We are hoping to better understand the needs of the youth you serve. As a first step, agencies will receive extensive detailed information about CARIBOU by CAMH. We will conduct an organization-wide meeting to explore receptiveness to deliver CARIBOU by CAMH. Questions about need, fit, and capacity will be covered during 2 virtual discussion meetings, which typically last 1.5 hours each. If you treat a high volume of youth with depression, this is the perfect opportunity to see what else can be done to help youth with depression. There is no expectation to implement CARIBOU by CAMH.
